The 2017 [Youth STEAM Institute](#) at the [National Youth Science Center](#) near Davis, West Virginia, will provide groups of 24 students an opportunity to enhance their experience, confidence, and leadership in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) through small-group projects guided by a mentor.

Program Overview: Youth STEAM Institute projects will be selected to address hard-to-cover national science and mathematics standards for student learning and may include: coding, electronics, engineering principles, mathematics, drones, meteorology, robotics, environmental science, astronomy, and more. Random Thoughts about Educators

When I began my career in education, I was given a textbook just like the ones the students had—there was not a teacher's edition. I had some chalk and a rough blackboard in a classroom with 30 filled desks and was teaching World History, a tenth-grade course. High-tech instruction involved television with VCR players and 8 mm and overhead projection. Because World History was a graduation requirement, I had seniors blended with the sophomores—and I was 4 years older than the seniors! A really good professional development was a workshop on how to prepare bulletin boards! Educators were just beginning to learn about learning disabilities, but not how to address them.

On the other hand, my new faculty mentored me, nurtured me, shepherded me through those early years as a career educator. I am indebted to them for their passion for doing what is best for students and for their commitment to each other and to new teachers. That faculty and my memories of their caring are golden. They—men and women—provided for me—a scared, resolute, unsure, not-very-knowledgeable beginning educator—support, comfort, guidance, confidence, and strategies. They gave me “genuine spiritual fellowship.”

I dedicate these observations to those powerful role-model educators who taught me how to teach.

Random thoughts about educators

1 The teachers who think their course or grade level is THE most important are the BEST teachers. They are passionate about their work, and their students sense it. What keeps those teachers going are former students who tell the teacher that they are grateful for something they learned in her class. Is it true

that most teachers chose the grade or subject they teach because that's where they found their favorite or most influential teacher?

If the teacher does not know the answer, she has the opportunity to say so and then go exploring for the answer with the most talented explorers in the world: her students. How the teacher treats a child establishes how the other students treat the child. I am inspired by the story of the girl who lost her hair to chemotherapy and was fearful of returning to school because of how she anticipated her classmates would react. When she arrived in the classroom, she saw that her teacher had shaved her head, and as the week progressed all the children shaved theirs too.

4 When a child is least lovable is when he needs most to be loved. It's difficult for the adult not to return anger or fear with anger. A count to 10 and a deep breath before a calm response can change relationships and lives for the better.



5 Sometimes the person in charge has to laugh to defuse a situation even when the situation is not really funny.

Beware: Students watch EVERYthing a teacher does and says. Students know their teachers better than the teachers know themselves. AND then the students emulate their teachers. For some children, this is the only class act they know (no pun intended).

When students arrive in class angry, they usually bring the anger with them from something that occurred somewhere else with someone else.

They often show their misery to the teacher standing before them because they trust her to accept them, understand them, and show them how to cope.

Students love to be praised appropriately—and so do their teachers.

9 Sometimes the teacher is the mediator for a teenager and his parent(s). Educators win championships without getting medals and prizes.

Educators are privileged to be a part of the most noble, most demanding, most important profession of all the professions in all times in all places. If you feel most alive when you are teaching (and learning), you have the gift of teaching (and learning) that impacts education worldwide.

And one more: Remember the Butterfly Effect? One small action can cause great change across the world. Every educator makes hundreds of decisions and commits thousands of deeds daily. That same educator is impacting tens of thousands of lives. YOU make a difference. WE make a difference.

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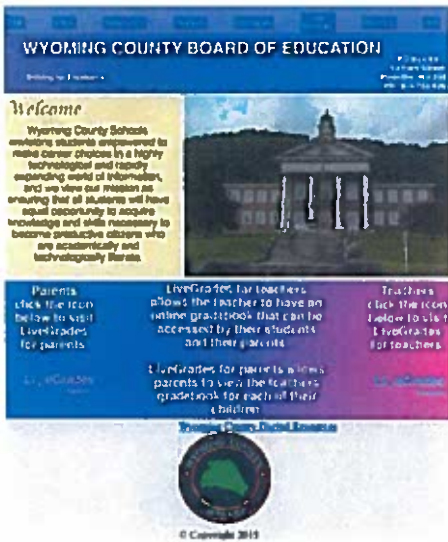
