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Wyoming County Schools Revised 2017-2018 School Calendar

Wyoming County Schools administrators have developed a revised school calendar to meet the state law requirement of 180 days of instructional time. Although the number of days was not waived, we were given the opportunity to be flexible in our revisions. In addition, employees are required to work 200 days to fulfill their contract requirements. We believe that the following plan best meets our legal requirements and supports our academic and strategic goals.

At this time, we have had seven (7) snow days and ten (10) walk out days to make up.

- Five (5) snow days were made up with Equivalent Time days (due to the accrued time at the end of each day).
- Two (2) snow days will be made up with OS days in the calendar: March 30 and May 25.
- Four (4) walk out days will be made up with OS days in the calendar: March 8 – 9, and March 15 – 16.
- Five (5) walk out days will be made up by employees during the scheduled Spring Break (April 2 – 6, 2018).
- Students will **NOT** be coming to school during Spring Break (April 2 – April 6, 2018).
- Students will now come to school on June 1, 4, and 5, 2018.
- The last day of school for students is now **June 5, 2018**.
- One (1) walk out day will be made up by employees on **June 6, 2018** which will be the last day for employees.

He also worked on the national level to help provide the safest transportation for our children. In memory of Jim Bailey, this scholarship was established to provide assistance to students of West Virginia who attend post-secondary vocational and technical programs. Since the inception of this scholarship program in 1999, the number of students to receive assistance has grown from 1 to approximately 12 and the amount of the scholarship has increased to \$600.00.

While we are constantly striving to provide the safest transportation for our students, it is our desire to assist with the education of our students by providing financial aid for those deserving students who wish to pursue opportunities beyond high school.
