Wyoming County's two high schools have been named recipients of this year's Jennings Randolph Award. Westside High School and Wyoming East High School both met the Gold Level requirement as set forth by the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office to win the award, by reaching 100 percent registration of eligible students to vote.

Students eligible to register to vote are either 18 years of age, or 17 years of age and will be 18 by the date of the next general election.

"We are extremely proud of our students," said Robin Hall, Assistant Superintendent of Secondary Schools. "They have shown their commitment to achieving success, being civic minded, and exercising their right to vote."

Westside and Wyoming East applied for the award by filling out an application to the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office, confirming that 100 percent of the schools' eligible students were registered to vote.

Named in honor of the late U.S. Senator Jennings Randolph, who fought to get the voting age lowered from 21 to 18, the award was created by the Secretary of State's Office to get young people involved in the voting process. Randolph was the sponsor of the 26th amendment to the US Constitution granting adults age 18-20 the right to vote.

While the two county high schools achieved the Gold Level status, there is also recognition for schools that obtain 85 percent of senior class voter registration. Students who garner Gold Level status receive a commemorative plaque by the Secretary of State's Office and Student Ambassador certificates are presented to student leaders. Silver Level achievers are mailed Student Ambassador certificates to leading students.

Both Wyoming County high schools were presented their plaques and certificates at their Senior Awards Assembly held May 24, 2018. Mac Warner, West Virginia Secretary of State, made the presentations. Warner noted that only 10 percent of high schools in West Virginia were recognized this year for the award.

Dalton Cline, a senior at Westside High School and second-year student of the Wyoming County Career and Technical Center, has been awarded a bronze medal in the state Skills competition held recently at Fairmont State University.

A student in the CNA class of Lynda Evans, Cline won the medal for his skills in CPR and First Aid.

He took both written and hands-on tests in CPR, First Aid, and bandages, and was required to handle different emergency situations.

Cline credited his instructor for much of his success, stating that she helped prepare him for the competition by giving him "different scenarios to learn from" and encouraged him to practice. She also certified the class in CPR.

The 18-year-old was the only participant from the Career Center to place this year, out of the 19 from the school who competed in various categories. It was his first year attending the competition, where he challenged other CNA students from all over the state.

"We are so proud of Dalton," said Kim Sibb-Runion, principal of the Career Center. "He is an exemplary student and works hard to perfect anything he tries to achieve. Dalton is one of our finest."

Dalton, who was also awarded the Citizenship Award at the Career Center, said he enjoys working out at the gym, spending time with his friends, playing X-Box and reading fictional books. He is also involved in the Hunting Club and Crafts at Westside. He is the son of Kim Chude Cline and Mark Allen Cline and resides with his grandparents, Ruth and Ellis Cline.

He plans to continue his education after graduation by enrolling in the LPN program at the Career Center. He will then attend Southern WV Community and Technical College to take his pre-requisite classes needed for becoming a registered nurse. His goal is to join the Air Force to continue his endeavor of being a Nurse Practitioner.

"Students like Dalton, who attend the Career Center, are trained in classes that will help them to go straight into the workplace after completion," stated Deirdre Cline, superintendent of Wyoming County Schools. "The Skills competition is just one example of how the school prepares these students for their career choices."
