New Principals story—w/art

Wyoming County Schools will have new principals at the helm of two of the elementary schools when school starts in September.

Christie Dameron and Alisha Deskins, both veteran teachers, will assume the administrative roles at Baileysville Elementary School and Pineville Elementary School, respectively. Dameron replaces former Baileysville principal, Darlene Osborne, who took the principal position at Road Branch Elementary and Middle School. Deskins will take over the position vacated by Donald Clay, who left to become Director of Buildings and Maintenance.

"We are pleased to welcome Mrs. Dameron and Mrs. Deskins to the Wyoming County Principal family," said Rebecca Cooke, Assistant Superintendent of Elementary and Middle Schools. "I am confident that both principals will be an asset to their respective schools as well as to the Wyoming County School system."

Dameron, who has spent the most of her teaching career at Road Branch, says she is excited to begin the next phase of her career at Baileysville. "I am looking forward to this new endeavor at Baileysville Elementary and Middle School," Dameron stated. "My passion is kids and helping people, so that led me to have a desire to pursue my leadership degree. I just prayed wherever God wanted me to be, that was where I would be, and here I am sitting in this chair."

Dameron said helping children has always been what she desired to do. "I played school as a little girl and there are holes in the wall in my room where I had my chalkboard and my imaginary students. My dream has always been to help kids." She went on to say that she has an open door policy and that "...if there is anything I can help anyone with, I am here. I am a servant of Wyoming County, most specifically the Baileysville area. I promise that I will be fair to everyone and no problem is too big or too small. I am ready and willing to tackle anything."

Dameron attended Southern West Virginia Community College for two years before going to Concord University and obtaining a Master's degree in Reading, and a Leadership Certification. She is married to her high school sweetheart, Keith Dameron, and they live at Cyclone. They have four children, a daughter, Kadee, who is a nurse in Charleston; a son, Hunter, a student at WVU; Bristol, who will begin kindergarten; and Liam, who just turned three.

Deskins is no stranger to Pineville Elementary School. She has spent much of her teaching career at the school and says going back is like "going home." "I know the staff and I know the children. I live in the community...and there is no other place I would rather be," she stressed.

Deskins had left the school a year ago to take a position as Digital Services Instructor at the Central Office. "Pineville Elementary is an amazing school with a super staff and the community is on board with education," Deskins stated. "It was just too good of an opportunity to serve children to pass up."

The new administrator says she is anxious to get started in her new role as principal of Pineville Elementary. "I am looking forward to opening new doors at Pineville Elementary and embracing new challenges with the community as a crucial stakeholder in the education of our children," she remarked. Deskins obtained a Master's Degree in Elementary Education and Special Education from the University of Phoenix. She has a National Board Certification in Special Education as well as a Technology Specialist endorsement. She and her husband, Joseph Deskins, live in Pineville and attend Cook Memorial Baptist

Church. They have two children, Brandi Deskins Thomas, and Dr. Christopher Deskins, both graduates of Wyoming East High School. The Deskins also have two granddaughters, Paisley and Charlie. Dameron and Deskins are both first-time principals.
