Design Information for the 2018 First Lady's Student Ornament Competition

- ❖ Only one ornament per class is allowed for judging
- ❖ Must represent the "Gingerbread Family" theme
- ❖ Can be three-dimensional but must measure no larger than 12 inches
- ❖ For the construction of the ornament, use lightweight materials such as paper, foam board, cardboard, felt, or papier-mâché.
- ❖ Be creative! Decorate your ornament with items such as glitter, photographs, crayons, paint, aluminum foil, or paper.
- ❖ On the reverse side of the decorated ornament, you must write the following:
 - Teacher's name
 - School and class
 - Email address
 - Phone number
 - Mailing address

If the information is not written on the reverse side of the ornament, it will be displayed on the tree but will not eligible for judging.

- ❖ Attach a five-inch loop of string or ribbon to hang the ornament on the tree.
- ❖ The ornament will not be returned
- ❖ The ornament must be postmarked or hand-delivered no later than Friday, October 26, 2018. Packages postmarked after the specified date may be accepted but will not be included in judging.
- ❖ The winning classes will be notified the week beginning November 12th.

RULES:

- ☆ Students age 11, 12 and 13 years old (by November 15) can participate.
- ☆ Each school will judge all their entries and send ONE winner to the county level.
- ☆ Artwork must be no smaller than 13" X 20"; and no larger than 20" X 24".
- ☆ Do not mat or frame artwork.
- ☆ All artwork must be the individual student's original creation. Duplications are not accepted.
- ☆ All media are accepted. (Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing.
- ☆ Do not laminate entries.
- ☆ Three-dimensional entries will NOT be accepted.
- ☆ Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.
- ☆ The use of lettering or numbering on the front of the poster, in any language, is not allowed.
- ☆ The student artist signatures and printed full name should be written on the back of the poster.
- ☆ Artwork should be done on a flexible material, so it can be rolled for shipping in a mailing tube.
- ☆ Do not fold poster.

Students are asked to create a poster that visually communicates the contest theme,
"Kindness Matters"

This opens up an opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss with children the true importance of peace.

U.S. Presidential Scholar Program Nominations

The U.S. Presidential Scholar Program began in 1964 under President Lyndon B. Johnson with the purpose of recognizing and honoring outstanding high school seniors, and thereby encouraging high attainment among all students. Outstanding scholarship has always been the basis of the selection of the honored students with demonstrated ability and accomplishment in the visual and performing arts or creative writing being added in 1979 and demonstrated excellence in CTE being added in 2016.

West Virginia will submit nominations to this worthy program in two categories this year. We will nominate 10 males and 10 females for a total of 20 students for the General component of the program. Additionally, we will nominate five (5) CTE students in the Career and Technical Education category. See below for general information and information on both categories.

Information for both General and CTE components:

- All WV nominations must be received by October 15, 2018.
- Submit General Nominations to Karen Larry at karen.larry@k12.wv.us.
- Submit CTE Nominations to Kathy D'Antoni kdantoni@k12.wv.us.
- Dr. Larry and Dr. D'Antoni will lead WVDE review teams to select WV's nominations to the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program with the nominees being announced via the Superintendent's Update.
- WV will submit its nominations to the U.S. Presidential Scholar Program which will undertake its selection process.
- The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program office will announce and invite students to apply for the national recognition.
- The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program Office will announce the 2019 U.S. Presidential Scholars in May 2019.
- All U.S. Presidential Scholars will be named by the Commission on Presidential Scholars and will receive the Presidential Scholars Medallion at a ceremony in their honor in Washington, DC.

General Component Nomination Request: Based upon the information provided us, the following considerations should be adhered to when nominating students.

- Nominate students who demonstrate outstanding scholarship, but who might not otherwise be nominated through the current SAT/ACT, Arts, or CTE recognition processes.
- Students nominated must meet these criteria:
 - Be graduating seniors between January and June of 2019
 - Be U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents
 - Attend public, parochial, or independent schools or be home-schooled.
- Also consider these questions when choosing your nominees:
 - What about the student makes him/her stand out as having outstanding scholarship?
 - Were there special challenges or hurdles this student has overcome while still achieving high academic success?
- National reviewers will consider the following categories when evaluating the nominees at the semifinalist and Scholar evaluation levels.
 - Involvement and Service (in school and community)
 - Leadership and Character
 - Writing samples
 - Academic achievements
 - Discretionary points for extraordinary achievement, heavy workload, family responsibilities, or obstacles overcome
- The Commission on Presidential Scholars will choose the 2019 U. S. Presidential Scholars.

Career and Technical Education (CTE) Nomination Request: Based upon the information provided us, you will want to nominate students “on the basis of outstanding scholarship and demonstrated ability and accomplishment in career and technical education fields.” You will also want to adhere to the following considerations when nominating students.

- Students nominated must meet these criteria:
 - Be graduating seniors between January and June of 2019
 - Be U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents
 - Attend public, parochial, or independent schools or be home-schooled.
- Candidates who are nominated and choose to apply, and whose applications are complete, will be reviewed by a committee of qualified individuals experienced in career and technical education.
- The national CTE selection committee will choose 60 applicants to be named as semifinalists.
- The 60 CTE finalist applications will be reviewed by the Commission on Presidential Scholars with the Commission making the final selection.

ELIGIBILITY

FORMAT

Student entries may be in any format. The style and the selected media must be explained on the attached entry form. **Entries without this information will not be judged.** An entry form must be taped to the back of the entry.

MEDIA

Pencil, crayon, pen and ink, water color, acrylic, serigraph wood block, photography and mixed media.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Each entrant is allowed only one entry. All entries will become the property of the Martin Luther King, Jr. West Virginia Holiday Commission. **All work must be original and not created from the internet.** The poster must focus on this famous quotation from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. *“Let us all hope that the dark clouds of racial prejudice will soon pass away and the deep fog of misunderstanding will be lifted from our fear-drenched communities, and in some not too distant tomorrow the radiant stars of love and brotherhood will shine over our great national with all their scintillating beauty.”*

2019 Project on Racism Contest Guidelines

ELIGIBILITY

The 2019 Project on Racism Contest is open to any student in grades 1—12 attending public, private, parochial, or home school in the State of West Virginia; or any student under the age of twenty enrolled in a high school correspondence/TASC program in the State of West Virginia. This year the Contest has expanded to include: Essays, Music, & 5 minute films.

The student does NOT have to be a U.S. citizen.

CONTACT INFORMATION FORM

Please submit your Contact Information Form along with your **original work**. Use a paper clip to attach the Contact Information Form to your medium. Do NOT staple your Contact Information Form to your **medium**.

There is no separate registration form.

ENTRY SUBMISSION

Entries may be submitted on or before November 1st, 2018. Each entry must include both an essay and a Contact Information Form. You will NOT receive acknowledgement of receipt.

Essays and Contact Information Forms may be submitted via e-mail, fax, U.S. Postal Service, or hand delivery. YWCA Wheeling is not responsible for entries not received due to network service outages or delays, computer difficulties, or any other technological malfunctions; or for entries that are lost, stolen, misdirected, late, ineligible, incomplete, or mutilated by the U.S. Postal Service.

Submit each entry only one time. Do NOT fax an entry multiple times. Do NOT fax and mail the same entry.

All entries submitted via e-mail must be received by midnight on November 1st, 2018. Please e-mail entries to cdcodirector@ywcawheeling.org and type "Essay/Music/Film submission" in the subject line.

All entries submitted via fax must be received by midnight on November 1st, 2018. Please fax entries to 304-232-0513 and write "Essay submission" as the recipient.

ESSAY REQUIREMENTS

Essays should not include any information that identifies the student, teacher, principal, or school. Any essay that includes identifying information will be automatically disqualified.

All essays will be photocopied for judges. Any essay that is illegible after photocopying will be automatically disqualified.

Essays should be a maximum of four (4) pages.

Essays may be handwritten, typed, or computer-generated in 12-point Times New Roman font.

Essays must be in English.

Essays must be the original work of the student. Parents/teachers/guardians may type or write a student’s work verbatim.

Each student may submit only one (1) essay. Please submit only one copy, i.e., do not fax and mail the same essay.

Essays must be in black ink on white paper, double-spaced, and on one side of the paper only.

Please number pages at the bottom, i.e., 1 of 4, 2 of 4, etc.

Do not include drawings, references, or other attachments.

Do not use staples. Use a paper clip to attach the Contact Information Form and the essay.

ESSAY PROMPTS GRADES 1 – 4

Has something ever bothered you? Did you ever speak up about something that was bothering you? How did it feel when you did?

ESSAY PROMPTS GRADES 5 – 8

Describe a time that you wanted to speak out about something, but didn’t

What stopped you from speaking up?

How can you overcome those things?

Describe some of the feelings associated with getting something off your chest?

ESSAY PROMPTS GRADES 9 – 12 & TASC

What are the first thoughts you have when you read the quote?
Does this quote make you think of a specific time or event in your life? Explain?
Does this quote apply to your approach toward life at all? If so, how?

2019 Project on Racism Contest Five Minute Film Competition

One of the newest additions to the Project on Racism contest is a Five Minute Film Contest. We are giving all the students the opportunity to create a film of five (5) minutes or less in length that is inspired by or has a theme based in this year's quote.

QUOTE:

“Our lives begin to end, the day we become silent about things that matter.”

Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr's speech on March 8th, 1965 in Selma, Alabama

The film's director(s) and actors must have been in high school, Middle school, or Elementary school while filming the project. This is a state wide film competition and thus accepts films from anywhere in the WV, as long as, you were in grades 1 through 12 when you made the film.

All films must be in English or subtitled in English.

DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES: Entries for the 2019 YWCA Project on Racism Five Minute Film Contest must be submitted on or before November 1st, 2018

ELIGIBILITY: Students must submit entries as required on the entry form to be eligible. Entries received after the deadline set forth in these terms are ineligible, null, and void.

HOW TO ENTER: Create a film of five (5) minutes or less in length that is inspired by or has a theme based in this year's quote. The film can be created by phone, camera, or any other visual recording device.

PERSONAL INFORMATION: Be sure to fill out the Contact Information Sheet and attach it or the information from it, with your submission

SELECTION AND NOTIFICATION OF WINNERS:

Winners will be announced before the end of December 2018.
